October General Meeting: The speaker will be Mary Jo Stabinski-Heckman, president of the PA Federation of Dog Clubs. She will be accompanied by Julian Prager, a PFDC member who has been active with the organization's legislative initiatives. In addition to general information about PFDC, Mary Jo plans to discuss animal rights versus animal welfare.

This particular program was arranged by Sue Reighard and should be attended by all club members. Club members are encouraged to invite friends and guests to what should be an informative program providing perspective and insight from people who are on the "front lines" of dog club, owner, and breeder issues.

Other News: NNKC is communicating with the Chambersburg Kennel Club regarding the potential of jointly hosting a three-day all-breed, rally, and obedience show for next July. Interest by both clubs and their respective boards is positive. Carol Brown has been spearheading the effort and several members from each club will be meeting soon to discuss arrangements and details. A primary goal of this effort is to increase the potential number of entries that is usually generated by a three-day event rather than a two-day show.

Agility changes could increase potential: Agility chairperson, Sue Houser, informs us that Agility Trials now have the option to include a "mixed breed" class. According to Sue, each day's trails are still limited to 660 entries, but since we have averaged only about 330 entries, we could potentially increase the number of entries and, thus, revenue. The board will need to discuss this matter and will do so in a brief meeting following Tuesday's general meeting.
